
*New Art Display in the Gathering Space:*

## ***September Centennial Celebration:***

### ***“A Penny for Your Thoughts...”***

A new month has begun and the primary focus of our centennial celebration will be a **penny scavenger hunt!** Children and “the young at heart” are encouraged to find a penny for each year since St. Andrew’s beginning in **1914** to the present. As you collect your pennies, bring them to church by **Sept. 15** and place them in the **“Penny Pot”** located in Byrne Hall. Once the pennies are collected, a team of volunteers will sort through them and try to find a penny for each year of our centennial. Those pennies will then be placed on a timeline and displayed in Byrne Hall. Important facts about St. Andrew’s history will be added to the timeline.

When the timeline is completed and displayed, parishioners will then have an opportunity to note any special occasions (marriage, baptism, confirmation, funeral, Cursillo, etc.) they or their families have experienced **at St. Andrew’s** on a sticky note (one per experience) and add the note(s) to the timeline. For example, my daughter was baptized at St. Andrew’s in 1980. I would add a sticky note with that information to the timeline above the 1980 penny. When completed, we will have a visual representation of St. Andrew’s long history of worship, ministry, and fellowship.

**Note:** Some pennies may be rare or valuable. If you choose to let us use a valuable or rare penny, please put it in a baggie labeled with your name and a note so we will know to return the penny to you. Otherwise, all pennies collected will be donated to the **Rector’s Discretionary Fund** at the end of the activity.
