WE HAVE BEGUN! The time has finally arrived for our new construction. Why are we doing this? Aside from the fact that we have very worn out electrical work, and a number of significant air conditioning and structural issues we needed to

address, this all has to do with the “Theology of Community.” The people of God, those who worship here, and those we hope will come, are the basic symbol of Christ in the world, and is the criterion against which design issues are measured.

The church is made up of people who believe in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ to be the saving pattern and event of their lives. We believe Christ calls us to communion/community. Each person’s life is a journey exploring the depth and breadth of the saving story of Jesus, learning over time how mature Christians act out this faith. And what this means, is that each of us deserves to worship to the fullest in the midst of this community. Over and over again I am hearing comments about how our present arrangement fosters real community. And I was struck beyond words of the beauty of one person rolling a wheel chair up to Communion, who has not been able to do this for months. What joy! Worshipping to the fullest means being able to hear better, being able to see better, being able to make it to the table without having to go so far—and that, my friends, is grace. The Commission for Church Building in the Episcopal Church tells us, “Good worship space unites the community through scale and proportion.” And this is exactly what this project is all about. As buildings are renewed- “...it results in a building that works for, not against, the worshipping community. We cannot afford to neglect the challenge of reshaping our older places of worship.”


