There are a number of opportunities, as has been mentioned some time back, to give an article in the new space in memory or in honor of someone. One such item is the baptismal font. Our new font will be a living water font, and has been underwritten by a generous donor. The font will reside just inside the new glass doors to remind us of our own baptism as we move to and from worship. The font is designed and will be crafted by our own Colleen Greene. The base of the font is depicted as the base of an olive tree. The olive tree is scripted many times in holy scripture, beginning in Genesis, when the dove returned to Noah in the ark carrying

an olive branch in its beak. Since that time the olive branch has been a symbol of peace. And God told Moses to anoint his brother Aaron with oil, which was comprised of olive oil and other spices. The menorah in the Tabernacle was lit with oil, as God told Moses to “Command the children of Israel that they bring to you pure oil of pressed olives for the light, to make the lamps burn continually.” Also, the log of oil used in the cleansing of the leper symbolized the return to favor of the one healed, and the return of honor and joy.

Another symbol on the font is that of the dove. The dove represents the Holy Spirit which comes upon the one baptized, infusing them with all the gifts of the spirit: love, joy, peace, etc. It is also a symbol of the fact that in baptism we receive everything needed for salvation.

And finally, at the base of the font are stones, Living Stones, to represent each one of us who are “Living Stones in a Living Sanctuary.” The water will also represent the life here at St. Andrew’s as it continues to move throughout the font. Please take a look at the rendering that Colleen has made for us. It is placed in front of the name tag display.


