

St. Andrew's Tidings A Message from Margaret,

"There was a man sent from God, whose name was John." (Jn.1:6) As in Advent 2, the gospel this week again focuses on the figure of John the Baptist. The Fourth Evangelist always refers to him simply as John, without the identifying

title of Baptist used by the Synoptic writers. There are no details here of John's personal background or appearance. He is the prophetic voice—a living presence of scriptural promise.

John's call was to be a witness to "testify to the light." It is made clear that John was not the light, but his task was to enable others to see the light – i.e., to witness to Jesus, the "true light." John as witness claims nothing further for himself and carries out that role in what follows. Thus when priests and Levites were sent from Jerusalem to question him about his identity, John confessed, "I am not the Messiah." As they continued to press him, John further insisted that he was not Elijah or the prophet. It was a commonly held belief that the return of Elijah or another prophet would signal the beginning of the Messianic era.

When the Pharisees asked John why he baptized if he was not the Messiah, Elijah, or the prophet, John replied that he baptized with water, but there was one whom they did not know who was far greater. Indeed, John was not worthy to perform the duty of the lowest slave—to untie his sandal.

This emphasis on Jesus as the one the world did not know is a recurring theme in John's gospel. Throughout his ministry Jesus was misunderstood by many, including his intimate followers. John clearly understood his own role as the messenger who prepared the way for the Lord—Jesus was the focal point not John. John had truly listened to God, knew what his own task was, and acted in humble obedience to follow that call.

This, then, is our task during this Advent-to truly listen to God in order to discern what our task might be-to hear what God is calling us to do-to be. Advent is also the ideal time, as we wait, longing in faith for the joy of the Incarnation to remind ourselves that Christians are never natural born. They are virgin born born, if at all, through the *Spirit* and *fire*.

Lane Denison reminds us that an "Advent sound of gentle stillness, a silent and holy moment can prepare us once again for due respect and kindness toward all of life—and toward ourselves, for we are God's beloved. The church can, the church must have a hand in this. We must turn from our crippling narcissism to the practice of reverence." Only then can we begin to bear fruits worthy of repentance.
